

Junior Prizegiving 2019 Awards and nominations process

Award	Criteria	Number per class
Pukeko	For students showing ongoing commitment to personal success and integrity in their learning. This replaces the Effort and Attitude awards. Students with 4 or more nominations across their classes will receive a certificate at prize giving. Students with 1-3 nominations will receive a certificate at a Merit Assembly prior to Junior Prizegiving.	Unlimited number of nominations per class. Students are nominated by their individual teacher.
Karearea	For students who are achieving at the top of their class. This award is for first place in class. All students nominated will receive a certificate at prize giving.	 Year 7-10 Core classes 1st, 2nd and 3rd for each subject in each class Year 7 & 8 options no nominations in this category. Year 9 & 10 options 1st, 2nd and 3rd for each group a teacher has taught.
Harkerss Buses Award	For students who are consistently living the RISE values both in class and across the school. Kaitiaki will shortlist the recipients.	Teachers nominate two students per class that they teach.
Kotuku	1st overall in year group	 The recipient of this award is worked out by the school's Student Achievement Manager using the following methodology: Based on the methodology used for Karearea awards 1st Place = 3 points 2nd Place = 2 points 3rd Place = 1 point Student with the highest points in class gains first in class Students who gained 1st or 1st equal in class are eligible for the Kotuku award Each Learning Area/Department is asked to rank students in subjects which are comparable across the group of students Similar points system as used in the Kareara awards is applied Student with the highest total score awarded 1st in year group.
